WHAT IT IS

A tornado and severe-storm readiness platform that turns a neighborhood into a shelter network. Take Cover maps every storm shelter in a housing community, connects residents to the nearest safe room, plans the route to reach it, and delivers live NOAA watch and warning alerts as conditions develop. Desktop and mobile, so residents, coordinators, and emergency managers work from the same shelter picture. Live now at takecoverapp.com, with local EMS collaboration in Calera, Oklahoma. Built to expand to tribal communities, housing authorities, and municipalities across tornado country.

CORE CAPABILITIES

■ Shelter Mapping

Every storm shelter in a housing community mapped and recorded, so residents know what exists near them long before the sirens.

■ Route to Safety

The app plans the route from where a resident is to the nearest available shelter - decided ahead of the storm, not during the warning.

■ Desktop & Mobile

Residents work from the phone in their pocket. Coordinators, housing staff, and EMS work from the desktop view of the same data.

■ Sovereignty-Aware by Design

Built by a Chickasaw-owned firm for tribal governments and housing authorities, with data governance asked at the start rather than retrofitted.

■ Neighborhood Shelter Network

Residents with safe rooms can share capacity with neighbors who have none. The shelters a community already owns become a network.

■ Live NOAA Alerts

Watch and warning alerts from the National Weather Service feed, delivered as conditions develop rather than after they arrive.

■ Community-Level Deployment

Stood up at the scale of a single housing community, then rolled up across a tribal nation or a municipality.

■ Built to Expand

Proven first in one Oklahoma community, and designed to carry to tribal nations, counties, and municipalities across tornado country.

WHY IT MATTERS

A shelter three doors down is not help if nobody knows it is there.

In a tornado warning, the difference between shelter and exposure is measured in minutes - and in whether a resident already knows where to go. Take Cover settles that question before the season starts: the shelters are mapped, the route is planned, and the alert arrives on the same device that holds both.
